



The Risk We Continue to Accept on Site

Across multiple site visits, one thing is clear

Different projects. Different teams. The same safety issues
This is not a coincidence. Its reflection of what is being accepted on our sites.

The Same Problems, Repeated

- Poor housekeeping materials left in walkways and work areas
- Incomplete edge protection and expose fall risk
- Inconsistent use of PPE
- Task being carried out without proper planning or coordination

When Risk Becomes Normal

The real problem is not just the presence of these hazards.

- They stop being reported.
- They stop being corrected.
- They become part of the job.

This is how complacency develops

Supervision Is More Than Being Present

- Seeing a problem is not the same as fixing it
- Being present is not the same as managing work
- Completing paperwork is not the same as ensuring safety

Lack of Competence

- Workers assigned to task they are not fully trained in
- Instructions given but not properly understood
- Work continue without proper verification

What Needs To Change

Unsafe conditions must be corrected immediately, supervisors must actively manage and control work, workers must only perform tasks they are trained and competent to do, and repeated issues must be addressed, not tolerated. Safety is not improved through inspections alone, but through consistent daily action. What is accepted on site today will determine what happens tomorrow.
